MOIG will participate to the INTERSPILL Conference from 08 to 10 April 2025 in Excel-London, Europe’s leading Oil Spill Conference and Exhibition, where international experts and leaders from the spill industry will connect and work together to address challenges raised by the future spills.

The conference will focus on increased spill risk caused by oil production’s shift towards mature basins, often with older infrastructure, and on concerns over pollutants like debris and plastics. Delegates will be addressed by global thought-leaders representing international spill response companies, the private sector as well as governmental a non- governmental bodies. In addition, a number of seminars, workshops, training events, and networking activities are planned to run in parallel with the conference and exhibition. CEDRE WEBINAR: SAMPLING SUITCASE SAMi



17 March 2025, the MOIG Director participated to Cedre webinar titled “Sampling suitcase SAMi” presented by Thomas LE BIHAN, head of project. The main objective of this project is to develop a tool that allows sampling and analysis in situ in order to collect reliable and relevant information transmitted in real time. This project is coordinated by Cedre and financed by Total Energy. The suitcase SAMi has a weight of 11 Kg and contains the following equipments:

Personal Protection Equipments (PPE), sampling materials, measuring probe, oil dispersion test, terminal Crosscall with dedicated application and data transmission device.

MEETING STIR-MOIG-CEDRE

13 March 2025, within the framework of the preparation of the training course on response to accidental oil pollution at sea and on the shoreline “IMO level 2” and the Practical Exercise to be held from 19 to 22 May 2025 in Bizerte-Tunisia, a meeting was held at the Tunisian Society of Refining Industries (STIR) between Feten REZGUI; STIR Environment responsible, Houcine MEJRI MOIG Director, and Arnaud GUENA (By video conference), Deputy Director and expert from the Center of Documentation, Research and Experimentation on Accidental Water Pollution (Cedre).



The main objectives of this meeting were to exchange ideas and views about the scenario, the oil spill response equipments to be deployed during the exercise and to discuss the logistical arrangements of the event. In addition, Houcine MEJRI accompanied by Feten REZGUI afforded the opportunity to see the new warehouse hosting the oil spill response equipments. A visit was also performed to the jetties; location in where the practical exercise will be conducted.
